Healing Generations Therapist (Co-Occurring Disorders)

Position Title: Healing Generations Therapist

Position Description: The Healing Generations therapist will serve the American Indian population in the Twin Cities area and provide individual, couples and family therapy/counseling to adults and children experiencing depression, grief, substance abuse, domestic violence, other emotional disturbances and environmental trauma. This position will have a focus on providing mental health support for participants who have co-occurring disorders. The therapist could also be providing services within the school systems and within the community organization. In addition, this position will also require co-facilitation of therapeutic support groups. This position reports to the Clinical Director.

Responsibilities:

- Provide child, adult, couples and family therapy
- Provide therapy for those participants who have co-occurring disorders
- Provision of therapeutic services to children and youth within the school systems
- Facilitation of therapeutic support groups
- Crisis intervention and consultation
- Perform assessments including psychological and diagnostic assessments
- Provide coordination of care for clients
- Facilitate talking circles/support groups for clients and the community at large
- Provide collaborative outreach/networking with family center partners and community agencies
- Maintain client files and confidentiality
- Manage data collection, quarterly and monthly reports
- Promote a chemically healthy lifestyle
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Director

Qualifications

- Master's Degree required. Licensure preferred, or on track toward licensure.
- Licensure in the areas of LP, LICSW, LGSW, LMFT and LPCC preferred
- Knowledge of or desire to learn more about the American Indian culture, community and its resources
- Experience working, planning and implementing programming in a community-based agency preferred
- A valid driver's license and active insurance are required for this position

- Experience in counseling clients who have a co-occurring disorder preferred
- Computer competence
- Attention to detail and good time management skills required
- Effective record keeping skills important
- Excellent verbal and written communications skills required
- No current problems related to drug or alcohol use required

Physical Demands

- Very light lifting (less than 15 pounds) may be required occasionally

Environment

- AIFC is a low noise facility (under 30dB) and has private offices and conference rooms. There will also be work in Saint Paul Public School buildings and other organizations as appropriate.
