<u>Purpose of Position:</u> The SUD Care Coordinator will serve the American Indian population in the Twin Cities area and provide Substance Use and Co-occurring disorders by co-facilitating individual, couples and family therapy/counseling to adults and families experiencing depression, grief, substance abuse, domestic violence, other emotional disturbances and environmental trauma.

Reports to: Treatment Director

Responsibilities:

- Pro-actively links participants to both internal and external resources based on their treatment needs and follows up on the progress/status.
- Co-facilitates treatment groups.
- Meets with clients individually to review treatment plans and weekly progress.
- A care coordinator must receive at least one hour of supervision regarding individual service delivery from an alcohol and drug counselor weekly.

Qualifications:

- Skilled in the process of identifying and assessing a wide range of client needs.
- Knowledgeable about local community resources and how to use those resources for the benefit of the client.
- Successfully completed 30 hours of classroom instruction on care coordination for an individual with substance use disorder.
- Has either:
 - 1. A bachelor's degree in one of the behavioral sciences or related fields; or

- 2. Current certification as an alcohol and drug counselor, level I, by the Upper Midwest Indian Council on Addictive Disorders; and
- Has at least 2,000 hours of supervised experience working with individuals with substance use disorders.
- Knowledge of or desire to learn more about the American Indian culture, community and its resources.
- Effective organizational skills with paperwork and file systems.
- Minimum of one year in recovery from substance use disorder.
- Excellent verbal and written communications skills.

Physical Demands:
